History:

- Women's suffrage movement: Definition: suffrage is the right to vote.
- ▶ 1848 Women's Rights Convention
- 1890 NAWSA Susan B. Anthony, Elizabeth Stanton
- Great War (WW1) 1914–1918

History (continued)

- ▶ 1919 Bill passed and ratified in 1920
 - Definition: ratified means officially making valid or formal consent.
 - Became the 19th Amendment to the U. S. Constitution
- Most southern states late to ratify:
 - AL 1953,
 - FL and SC 1969 (man on moon),
 - MS 1984 (they wanted to be sure...)

History (continued)

- ▶ 1920 NAWSA became LWV
 - Carrie Chapman Catt
 - Eleanor Roosevelt
- LWV: a political grassroot citizens organization driven by the consensus of its membership.
 - Non-profit
 - All volunteers

 - National, State and Local
- Political
- Non-partisan (all political parties), men and women. League members are urged to work for the political party of their choice. The LWV supports issues not candidates.
