**MEDIA ADVISORY – Mobile County Judge of Probate Don Davis Speaks about the Role of the Probate Court in Elections as LWV-Mobile Focuses on “Voting 101”

**MOBILE** – LWV-Mobile examines the role of the probate court in elections with Mobile County Probate Judge Don Davis at its next monthly luncheon.

“The League of Women Voters was founded 98 years ago this month to assist women fulfill their new responsibilities as voters when the 19<sup>th</sup> Amendment went into effect,” said LWV-Mobile President Mary Anne Wilson. “Voter education remains one of the important pillars of League programming today. This month the Mobile League turns our attention to ‘Voting 101’, and we are pleased to have Judge Davis speak and inform us about elections and the role of the Probate Court.”

Judge Davis graduated from the University of South Alabama in 1978 with a Bachelor of Arts degree in political science and from Cumberland School of Law of Samford University in 1981. He was the youngest person to serve as Judge of Probate when he was first elected in November 2000.

Judge Davis received the Mobile Bar Association's Liberty Bell Award (2003) and the Outstanding Mobile County Judge Award by the South Alabama Volunteer Lawyers Program (2012).
